

US History EOI: 4 -Explain the significance of Pearl Harbor

This activity is designed to: 1. Allow students to demonstrate their knowledge of the significance of Pearl Harbor.
There are three levels of difficulty:

Level I: Match same picture/word symbol to the same picture/word symbol on the worksheet.

Level II: Place the picture/word symbol to the correct place on the worksheet (with color cues).

Level III: Place the picture/word symbol to the correct place on the worksheet (no color cues).

Instructions:

Make sure Boardmaker is in Design mode (press CTRL + D or ESC to change to Design mode).

Print the worksheet and symbols needed for your student.

Allow student to cut apart labels and/or cut them out for the student.

Allow the student to tape, glue or otherwise place the label in the correct spot on the worksheet.

****For students with physical disabilities, you can place the picture labels on a communication device, have an assistant point to a spot on the worksheet and ask the student to choose the correct answer from their communication device. The assistant then moves the student's choice to the diagram and secures it in place (velcro, tape, glue). You can also use the high tech version of this activity which is modified for switch access.**

****You can also print and laminate the worksheet(s) and label(s) and use velcro to create an activity that can be used over and over by multiple students. You will need approximately 3" hard/hook velcro and 1.5"soft velcro to assemble all three worksheets.**

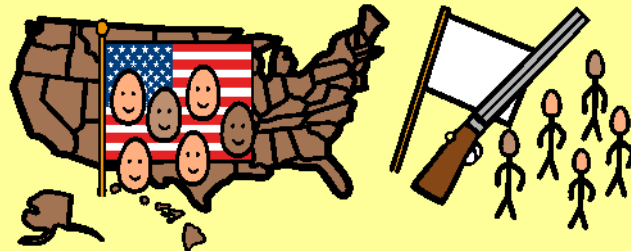
