#### Workshop Description:

Trying to find materials that are truly EASY enough for your emergent readers age 9 and up, but truly HIGH INTEREST? This workshop focuses on interactive literacy learning for upper elementary, middle school, and secondary students with severe disabilities, including students who use augmentative and alternative communication. Participants will see and try strategies for adapting or developing appropriate reading materials.

#### Caroline Musselwhite:

Dr. Caroline Musselwhite is an assistive technology specialist with more than 25 years of experience working with children and adolescents with severe disabilities, in a variety of settings, including Head Start, developmental day programs, and the public schools. She has also taught courses at several universities, including Northeastern University, West Virginia University, and Western Carolina University. Dr. Musselwhite has authored a number of textbooks and "how-to" books on a range of topics, including Emergent Literacy Success, Communication Programming for Persons with Severe Handicaps, and Reading Activities Project for Older Students (R.A.P.S.). She has also authored a number of software programs (Write to Talk, Social Scripts) and books (Learning to Work) for youth with disabilities. She has presented thousands of workshops in more than 20 countries throughout the world, and is a founding member of the Board of Directors for the International Society for Augmentative and Alternative Communication. Honors include: Foundation Fellowship (West Virginia University), Educator of the Year (Association for Retarded Citizens, North Carolina), Honors of the Association, (North Carolina Augmentative Communication Association), and DiCarlo Outstanding Clinician Award (North Carolina Speech-Language-Hearing Association).

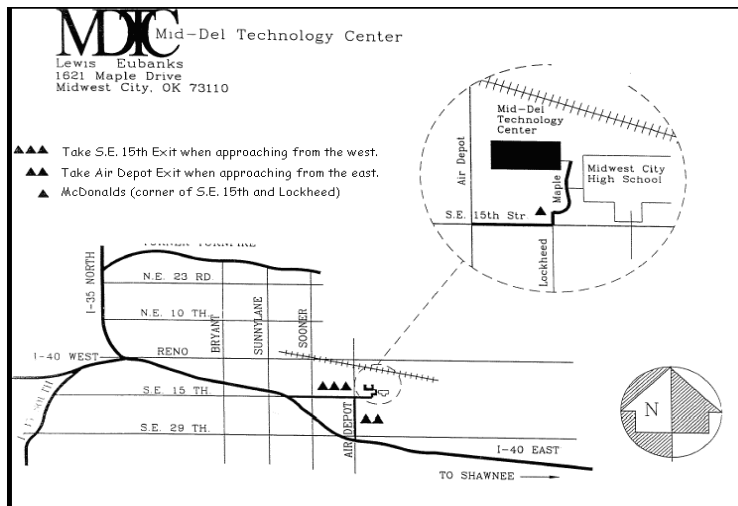

### From Oklahoma City:

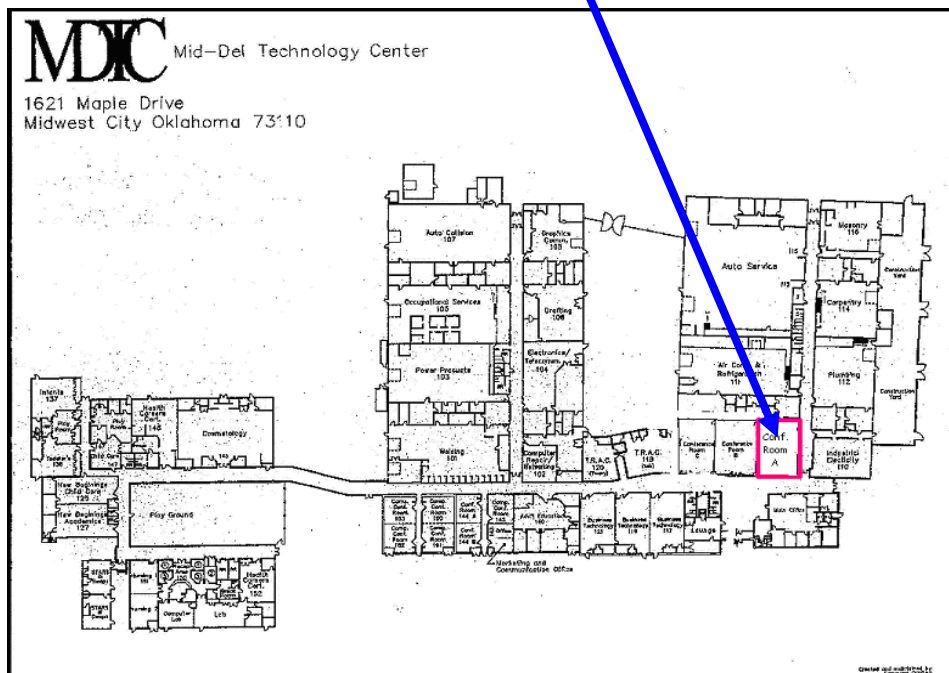
